## Dear ASAF members and friends,

In the last few months, since our last newsletter, the African Students and Alumni Forum (ASAF) has made some major steps. The grounds for the development of ASAF were laid and ASAF touched some major milestones. ASAF is a forum, that is still in development, but already offering opportunities for exchange, collaboration and capacity building to African beneficiaries of international mobility scholarships funded by the European Union.

## A message from Brussels by Fiorella Perotto (DG EAC):

At the beginning of 2019, ASAF was little more than an aspiration from the African Union, the European Union and a small but determined group of volunteers. As we reach the end of the year, ASAF is becoming a promising reality with record numbers of registered members across the African continent.

While increasing its visibility within the African higher education community, ASAF is now also laying the foundations for future partnerships with public and private stakeholders to ensure that young people in Africa are adequately skilled to find a job or create their own company and actively support their communities.

In a globalised world where lifelong learning and people's cross-border exchanges are major factors for prosperity and peace, ASAF is also reflecting on how it can make its know-how available to policy makers to help them enhance and modernise education policies in Africa in line with the United Nations' Sustainable Development Goals and the African Union's Continental Education Strategy (CESA 2016-2025).

With best wishes to all the ASAF volunteers without whom none of this would be possible.

## Most previous milestone: the four regional workshops across Africa

To sharpen the vision, the mission statement and the identity of ASAF considering the diversity of the African continent ASAF called for four regional Workshops to co-create the future of the Forum.

Out of more than 340 applications about 100 participants were selected to take part in one of the four regional workshops across Africa. The workshops were held in Accra, Rabat, Pretoria and Addis Ababa between 8<sup>th</sup> November until 8<sup>th</sup> December. The four workshops groups were very diverse trying to cover different criteria such as gender,

disability, mobility programmes and types as well as countries of origin. In the end 36 different countries were represented leaving some additional scope to strive for an even higher diversity. The workshops also addressed the participants in French and English to ease a wider outreach.

Thanks to the participants' commitment, motivation and active participation the workshops were a full success and very productive. In order to assess the different opinions and perspectives on ASAF's vision, mission, membership and identity, the content of every workshop in the four different cities were set up the same. The main goal was to shape ASAF and set ASAF's base to further develop and grow. In all four workshops, the participants worked on ASAF's mission, vision, membership and identity. The similarities and differences in the outcomes reflect the richness of Africa. Furthermore, the participants worked on and shared their personal project ideas in regard to the future ASAF local projects. At every workshop, a high table session with relevant stakeholders in cooperation with the European Delegations or National Erasmus+ Offices took place. This set the grounds for future collaborations and discussions with significant stakeholders in the landscape of Higher Education, employment and important local and continental organisations and networks.

#### Cosmas Kombat, participant in Accra:

What were your take always of the workshop?

"The ASAF ACCRA workshop- offered a regional platform to shaping the future of the association. There are existing national and regional higher education trainings and youth entrepreneurship opportunities that ASAF could take and engage with to reach their goal.

Participants are willing to engage further on ASAF projects and activities in their respective countries."

What was your personal experience?

"Diversity of workshop participants enriched the discussions. I was impressed by the number of mobility stories within Africa and Europe that most participants told and how these have empowered their performance at work in their various countries. The motivation and interest of participants to ensure that ASAF develops into a vibrant regional organisation."

What were your take aways of the workshop?

"It was clear that the youth of Africa are not resting in their quest to find opportunities to collaborate, co-create and contribute meaningfully to the development of the continent. I observed that the notion of skilled young people always in search of greener pastures abroad was trumped by a different narrative of African youth seeking to remain and make a difference in their communities."

What was your personal experience?

What were your take aways of the workshop?

"The show of commitment by the African Union to give a platform and support to ASAF demonstrated in the speech by Dr. Mahama Ouedraogo, Director, Human Resources Science and Technology Department, African Union Commission and the affirmation of continued support by the European Union through Mr. Thomas Huyghebaert, Head of Cooperation, European Union Delegation to the African Union."

#### What was your personal experience?

"Represented were 3 regions and emergence of further need urgent to collaborate at personal and individual level within the regions and also with other regions not present even beyond the ASAF framework to leverage on the skills and expertise gained through mobility."

How would you describe the energy of the group and the workshop?

"The age spectrum was skewed towards the upper age limit and majority were working in higher education. However, the crossover of the discussions were anchored on the need for open access to information, increasing mobility through education, concerted efforts towards diffusing the continents demographic time-bomb. The teams were fast at arriving at how to start and formulate their discussions resulting quick turn-arounds and having common understanding."

# Erasmus+: EU will invest over €3 billion in young Europeans to study or train abroad in 2020:

"The European Commission published its 2020 <u>call for proposals</u> for the <u>Erasmus+</u> programme. 2020 is the last year of the current European Union programme for mobility and cooperation in education, training, youth and sport. The expected budget of over  $\in$ 3 billion, an increase of 12% compared to 2019, will provide even more opportunities for young Europeans to study, train or gain professional experience abroad. As part of the 2020 call for proposals, the Commission will launch a second pilot on <u>European</u> <u>Universities</u>. Moreover, the EU aims to create 35,000 opportunities for African students and staff to participate in the programme as part of the <u>Africa-Europe Alliance for</u> <u>Sustainable Investment and Jobs</u>."
